Hot Topics in HIV/AIDS

REGISTRATION: Hot Topics in HIV/AIDS

About the Program:

The purpose of this program is to provide detailed information on four key aspects of HIV care. For example, acute HIV infection mimics many viral type illnesses, therefore detection and early diagnosis requires special attention.

Also, the 2006 CDC recommendations for HIV testing in the US is an additional means to capture undiagnosed HIV disease in order to further reduce HIV transmission rates and promote prevention.

Most health care providers are concerned about the proper protocol after an exposure to blood so "what should we do?" will be addressed.

There is also substantial evidence demonstrating that the presence of other STDs increases the likelihood of both transmitting and acquiring HIV. This relationship and the above statements will be reviewed.

Objectives:

1. Describe the clinical presentation, testing procedures, diagnosis, treatment and secondary prevention issues surrounding acute HIV infection and the benefits of early detection of HIV.
2. Discuss the CDC recommendations for HIV screening of adults, adolescents and pregnant women, and how to work within WV regulations.
3. Review blood borne pathogen exposure and outline the procedures following an exposure.
4. Describe WV screening protocols for STIs in healthcare settings, and the signs and symptoms of STIs.
