Asa Radix is the Director of Research and Education at The Callen Lorde Community Health Center in New York. Asa trained in internal medicine, infectious diseases and public health at the University of Connecticut Health Center.

In addition to having a clinical practice focusing on HIV primary care and transgender health, Asa coordinates electives in LGBT Health for medical and nursing students and holds faculty positions at NYU and Yale. Dr. Radix has been a board member of the Gay and Lesbian Medical Association, the National LGBT Advisory Council, the American Conference for Treatment of HIV, associate editor of Transgender Health and member of the editorial boards for the international Journal of Transgenderism and the PRN Notebook. Other contributions include being an advisor for the World Health Organization/PAHO on HIV, STI and transgender health issues. Dr. Radix is the site-PI/co-investigator for 3 NIH/NIMH studies, including a demonstration project on PrEP.
